## Arrival and Dismissal Updates

Thank you in advance for your flexibility and patience during the first couple of weeks of school. Please note, during arriv al and dismissal times, there is usually heavier car rider trafficthan normal. During the entire school year scholars must be picked up from their designated dismissal locations. For the safety of both scholars and staff members, the only parents/guardians permitted to walk up and retrieve a child are the parents with scholars in our Pre-K program. This process is secured and all Pre-K scholars must be signed in and out daily. Walkers will continue to be dismissed from the gate at the front entrance. Every parent or guardian picking up a scholar from the car rider area, must have the appropriate car rider tag displayed at all times. Scholars will not be released to anyone without an appropriate car rider tag. In order to sign a scholar out of school, every adult must bring a valid photo ID and must be on the scholar's contact information. I strongly encourage all parents to make sure the contact list is updated through our front office. It is vital when dropping off or picking up a child, please pull all the way down to the first cone in the carloop and maintain a safe distance between other vehicles. By doing so, the car rider process will be more efficient.
